STORAGE, DISPLAY, TRANSPORTATION and HANDLING of FIREARMS by **INDIVIDUALS REGULATIONS**

Non-Restricted

STORAGE of NON-RESTRICTED FIREARMS

- 1. Firearm must be **unloaded** (incl. antiques).
- Make firearm inoperable with a secure locking device, such as a trigger lock; OR Remove the bolt or bolt carrier; OR Lock firearm in a sturdy, secure container/ room that cannot easily be broken open/into.
- **3. Ammunition** for the firearm **must** be kept separate from and not accessible to the firearm: **OR**

In the same locked container as the firearm.

DISPLAY of NON-RESTRICTED FIREARMS

- 1. Firearm must be unloaded (incl. antiques).
- Make firearm inoperable with a secure locking device, such as a trigger lock; OR Lock firearm in a sturdy, secure container/ room that cannot easily be broken open/into.
- Ammunition for the firearm must not be displayed with nor accessible to the displayed firearm.

TRANSPORTATION of NON-RESTRICTED FIREARMS

- 1. Firearm must be unloaded (incl. antiques).
- 2. If left in an unattended vehicle (no adult or minor with a minor's licence stays with the firearm), firearm (incl. antiques) **must** be locked in trunk/similar compartment of vehicle; **OR**
 - If vehicle does not have trunk/similar compartment, firearm (incl. antiques) must be out of sight inside the locked vehicle.

Restricted/Prohibited

STORAGE of RESTRICTED/PROHIBITED FIREARMS

- **1.** Firearm must be **unloaded** (incl. antiques).
- 2. Make firearm inoperable with a secure locking device, such as a trigger lock; AND Remove the bolt or bolt carrier from an automatic firearm (if removable) and lock it in a separate room that cannot easily be broken open/into; AND Lock the firearm in a sturdy, secure container/ room that cannot easily be broken open/into.

OR

Lock the firearm in a vault/safe/room that was built or adapted for storing these types of firearms.

 Ammunition for the firearm must be kept separate from and not accessible to the firearm; OR In same locked container/vault/safe/ room as the firearm.

DISPLAY of

- RESTRICTED/PROHIBITED FIREARMS
- **1.** Firearm must be **unloaded** (incl. antiques).
- Make firearm inoperable with a secure locking device, such as a trigger lock; AND Remove the bolt or bolt carrier from an automatic firearm (if removable) and lock it in a separate room that cannot easily be broken open/into; AND In a dwelling-house, securely attach all firearms to something that cannot be moved; AND

In a place other than a dwelling-house, securely attach all firearms to the display with something strong, like a chain or metal cable. A firearm can be handled under the direct and immediate supervision of person displaying it. Ammunition must not be displayed with nor accessible to the displayed firearm. In a place other than a dwelling-house, keep ammunition in a securely locked container that cannot easily be broken open/into.

TRANSPORTATION of RESTRICTED/PROHIBITED FIREARMS

- 1. Firearm must be unloaded (incl. antiques).
- 2. Make firearm inoperable with a secure locking device, such as a trigger lock; AND

Remove the bolt or bolt carrier from an automatic firearm (if removable); **AND**

Lock firearm in a sturdy, opaque container that cannot easily be broken open/into, or accidentally opened during transportation.

If left in an unattended vehicle (no adult or minor with a minor's licence stays with the firearm), firearm **must** be locked in trunk/similar compartment of vehicle; **OR**

If vehicle does not have trunk/similar compartment, firearm must be out of sight inside the locked vehicle.

NOTES:

- Antique handguns do not require a secure locking device. All other transportation provisions apply.
- An Authorization to Transport issued by the Chief Firearms Officer (CFO) is required to transport restricted and prohibited firearms.
- **Replica firearms** must be locked in trunk/similar compartment of vehicle **OR** if vehicle does not have trunk/similar compartment, replica must be out of sight inside the locked vehicle.

EXCEPTIONS TO STORAGE AND TRANSPORTATION REQUIREMENTS OF NON-RESTRICTED FIREARMS:

- In areas where it is legal to fire a gun, a non-restricted firearm needed to control predators can temporarily be unlocked, but must be unloaded, and ammunition kept separate and not accessible to firearm.
- In a remote wilderness area, a non-restricted firearm can be kept handy and unlocked, but it must be unloaded.
 Ammunition can be kept handy. If left in an unattended vehicle that has no trunk/ similar compartment that can be locked, the firearm must be rendered inoperable by a

secure locking device (unless for predator control) and kept out of sight.

• A muzzle-loading firearm transported between hunting sites does not have to be unloaded, as long as its flint or firing-cap is removed. This is not a legal text. It is intended to provide general information only. For detailed information, consult the Police Officer Field Handbook or the Firearms Officer Desk Manual. For legal references and exceptions, refer to the *Firearms Act* and its Regulations. Please note that other federal, provincial/territorial, or municipal laws or regulations may apply.
